

#### **DNR Update:**

- Joe Stewig- area fisheries manager for the MN DNR will be in attendance at our annual meeting on April 21st.
- Pearl Lake is stocked every other year so our next stocking is scheduled for 2023. Our stocking rate is 1 lb/littoral acre (# of acres < 15 feet deep). So Pearl Lakes quota is 511 lbs.
- Pearl Lake is part of a long-term sentinel lakes study
- Sampling occurs every 3 years and this will occur in 2023. Final reports will be available March 2024

## Ice Fishing on Pearl Lake

<u>Fishing License</u> - You need to buy a Minnesota fishing license if you're 16 or older. Annual licenses allow you to fish from March 1 to the last day of February the following year.

Remember ice never is 100% safe. Your <u>safety is your responsibility</u>. Check ice thickness every few feet.

You can catch some fish such as crappie, catfish, sunfish, perch and bullhead at any time. Fish such as walleye, northern pike and bass – commonly called gamefish – can only be caught during certain times of the season.

• Special Fishing Regulations: Pearl lake has special fishing regulations that differ from statewide or border water regulations for those species identified below and take precedence. Regulations listed below are currently in place. Visit the <u>fishing</u> regulations page for links to upcoming regulations for specific lakes.

• Northern Pike: All from 24-36" must be immediately released. Possession limit three, only one over 36".

#### Ice fishing Etiquette

- Be mindful of other drilled holes, and do not drill on a plowed road.
- Do not drill holes near another fish house. Did you know that between the weight of the snow combined with the weight of the fish house, punching a hole too close to a permanent fish house will flood the entire area. Water gets on top of the ice and underneath all of the snow creating slush and a very difficult situation.
- Do not set up too close to others. Minimum of 10ft is law (but etiquette is 50ft). It might be tempting if you heard there is a good bite in the area or you see someone catch a fish, but those with good etiquette will not set up close to others who are already there.
- Keep quiet and be respectful of others
- Don't speed on the ice, considerate ice speed is 10mph or slower. Vehicles make waves which causes the water to move and flex.
- Clean up your trash. Leave it better than you found it is the Golden Rule. Use black or colored garbage bags that show up against the white snow. Secure your trash you take off the ice. Have a plan on where you will deposit the trash after leaving the ice. Pick up for others if they missed something.
- Do not come on the ice without a restroom plan.
- Do your best to release fish, healthy as possible. Know the rules. Snap a picture and release it back if it doesn't fit the slot. Side by side motion is the best. Don't take the fish outside if it is really cold out. Their eyes, gills and fins can freeze in a hurry. Don't hold a fish by it's eyes. Keep your fingers out of the red parts of the gills.
