Grants

State grant money was approved this year for Pearl lake off shore spraying. Grant was for \$9,000 with the required cost of a delineation survey with was \$1500. Lake management will be completing \$7500. spraying and the PLLA will match \$7500. for the weed spraying 40 acres will be projected to be treated. 24 acres was last completed in 2019.

Hand vote in room was to continue with the plan for lake management to spray for the grant and PLLA funds. Delineation survey will be completed and support where target areas are and need for treatment.

DNR only allows 10% of the lake to be sprayed since it is a stocking year, water levels will also be taking into consideration at the time.
